





  - Last sunspot min., Apr. 2020, next max., Jul. 2025 (R≈115?)
- Mercury
  - In evening sky, greatest elongation Aug. 10 (27  $^\circ\,$  ) currently 22  $^\circ\,$  , mag -0.2 increasing (+5 to -2)
  - Inferior conjunction Sept. 06
  - Today, rise 07:00, transit 14:30, set 21:50
- Venus
  - In evening sky, greatest elongation June 04 (45  $^\circ\,$  ), currently 28  $^\circ\,$
  - Inferior conjunction Aug. 13
  - Today, rise 07:55, transit 14:45, set 21:30
